Paul is going to pitch in the big match this week. He will do his best not to botch the game. Each day, he will stretch his arms and legs and play catch to prep.



Mitch will go to the pond to catch some fish. If he does not catch any fish with his rod and bait, he will ditch the pole and switch to a net so he can try to snatch some up.

Assessments

Teachers can use the reading assessment to measure mastery of real words, high-frequency words, decodable sentences, and nonsense words that contain the feature. A list of spelling words is included to assess encoding.
